



Minor Ailments Service for Wales

PSNC has welcomed news that the Welsh Assembly Government has agreed a National Minor Ailments service to begin next year.

PSNC Chief Executive Sue Sharpe said:

"It is excellent news that Wales has followed Scotland by agreeing to a national Minor Ailments Service. The lack of such a service in England is a missed opportunity and results in a terrible waste of resources and pharmacists' expertise.

"PSNC's submission to the 2008 Pharmacy White Paper, made jointly with PAGB, forcefully made the case for a national Minor Ailments Service, which would support and encourage patient self-care, free up time for GPs, and make considerable financial savings for the NHS.

"NHS reforms in England may be consuming resources at the Department of Health, and we were pleased to be able to launch the 2011 contract service changes in this context. A lack of resources, however, is no excuse to make the development of a national minor ailments service less of a priority. The UK spends approximately £1.5 billion every year on GP consultations for minor ailments, and in a cash-strapped NHS, developing the role of community pharmacy to tackle this problem should be any easy decision."
